Results:

- Creating a learning environment based on collaborative and participatory methodologies through transnational cooperation activities;

- Training 12 professionals, from partner organisations, involved in a process of self-reflection about themselves and their practices;

- Designing of an handbook in emotional literacy, incorporating the skills and experiences of each partner: in this sense, the incorporation of the methodologies used by each of the different partners in the most vulnerable public intervention, will be merged in a training model that promotes emotional literacy of technicians;

- 60 adult educators (15 from each partner country) will be able to disseminate these methodologies.
